## Check Your Water!!!!

When the temperatures fall this season make sure to check the temperature of your horses' water tank. Research shows horses drink more water if the temperature is around 60 degrees; 40-100% more water! The primary cause of impaction colic is dehydration. When horses go from lush pasture to dry hay and reduce their water consumption due to cold weather, impaction colic is a possibility. To reduce the chances of that happening; check your water tank daily (2-3x if possible) to be certain your tank heater is working correctly. Most tank heaters are thermostatically controlled with automatic shut-off. If you know you have a horse that gets finicky about drinking or if you just want to help out your whole herd, we have a product that may help keep them drinking. Hydration Pellets by Tech Mix use a technology that once consumed helps the cells in the animal "open up" to receive more water and more nutrients. Hydration pellets contain a proprietary blend of salts and sugars to keep your horse balanced and drinking whether its from exertion or drop in barometric pressure.
