| Patient Lift (Hydraulic)* | Common Diagnosis | | | |
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| A Patient Lift is a hoist with a "U" shaped, wheeled base. The base is connected to a hydraulic cylinder which can be pumped up or down with a handle or foot control. A shaft extends from the cylinder and a patient is supported by chains and a sling. This item lifts a patient in and out of bed to transfer him to and from a wheelchair or commode. The lift is used by patients that cannot transfer themselves due to weakness, stroke, paralysis, etc. but who are required to move periodically to improve their condition. *Some Patient Lifts are not hydraulic: they are crank type | 897.6 | Bilat.
