## **WARNERT RACING BLITZES CANADIAN NATIONAL TREMBLAY WINS AGAIN, OHMAN PODIUMS TWICE**

**St. Cloud, Minnesota February 22, 2010** – Success breeds more success and the East Coast swing of the ISOC National Sno-Cross Series has proven that for Warnert Racing as their race team continues to make more trips to the podium. Round seven of the ISOC National Sno-Cross Series was held at a first time venue in Sarnia Ontario and the team felt great about the track right from the start.

Friday qualifying was great for Tim Tremblay as he adapted to rough conditions immediately, while teammates Emil Ohman and Steve Taylor struggled a bit and had to go through the last chance qualifier to get into the final. When the green flag flew for the final Tremblay jumped out to a strong start in second and set his sights on first place. When the leader came off his sled Tremblay took over the lead and continued on to his third win of the season. Ohman had a different route as he put in one of the best races of the year with a charge from thirteenth to second and looked to be the only one who could catch Tremblay. But the hard laps moving through traffic took its toll and Emil had to settle for second.

The Saturday Pro Open qualifying was a role reversal for Tremblay and Ohman as Tremblay struggled and had to use the LCQ to make the final while Ohman transferred directly with a strong effort. In the final Ohman launched with a mid pack start, and again showing the ability to pass where others struggled, worked his way to a third place finish and second podium of the weekend. Tremblay had a tough race in Pro Open as he came off the sled a couple times and had to settle for a thirteenth place finish behind Taylor in twelfth.

The Warnert Semi-Pros looked like they were having another great weekend as Justin Broberg lead the Semi-Pro Open class across the finish line first with Darrin Mees third and Dylan Martin fifth – but the race officials had another version as Broberg was disqualified for jumping in a yellow flag area. The move pushed Mees and Martin up a spot each.

In the Semi-Pro Stock class all three racers made the final, ran well but struggled to stay on their sleds and finished mid pack.
